

EMS Health Message

Trumbull EMS reminds you to seek treatment if you ever experience signs of a possible Heart Attack. Some possible signs of a Heart Attack can include but are not limited to:

- Chest discomfort. Most heart attacks involve discomfort in the center of the chest that lasts more than a few minutes, or that goes away and comes back. It can feel like uncomfortable pressure, squeezing, fullness or pain.
- Discomfort in other areas of the upper body. Symptoms can include pain or discomfort in one or both arms, the back, neck, jaw or stomach.
- Shortness of breath with or without chest discomfort.
- Other signs may include breaking out in a cold sweat, nausea or lightheadedness.

Please call 911 if you believe you are experiencing one or more of these possible signs of a Heart Attack. Trumbull EMS and First Responders can begin treatment when they arrive and will ensure safe transport to the hospital.
