(Must show CT Driver's License)

#### What To Bring:

Household hazardous waste no longer needed, 20 gallons & 20 pounds per household. We reserve the right to refuse unidentified materials and large amounts of hazardous waste.

- > Paint Thinner, Solvents, Stains & Varnishes
- > Solvent Adhesives
- > Lighter Fluid
- > Waste Fuels: Kerosene, Gasoline

- > Pesticides & Insecticides
- > Weed Killers, Moth Balls
- > Flea Powder
- > Resins & Adhesives

#### How Do I Transport These Materials Safely??

- > Bring materials in original containers securely closed.
- > Pack containers in sturdy upright boxes and pad with newspaper, if necessary.
- > Never mix chemicals together!
- > Never smoke or eat while handling hazardous materials.
- > Leaking or broken containers must be contained.
- > Do not leave vehicles unless instructed to do so.
