## Trumbull Memorial Day Parade

The ceremony at the Viet Nam Veterans Memorial is at 7:30AM, and the main ceremony at Town Hall is prior to the start of the parade at 8:30AM. The parade begins on Main Street at 10 AM from Marisa's to the Town Hall. Come and honor all our Veterans.



### *Did you know?*

Both Memorial Day and Veterans Day are federal government holidays that honor American military personnel. However, Veterans Day honors all past and present American veterans, and Memorial Day is set aside to remember specifically those who have died in battle. Memorial Day was originally called Decoration Day and the name was formally changed in 1882.

Veterans Day, which is celebrated every November 11, honors all the people that have served or are currently serving in the military. It does not matter whether they served during war or peace, as Veterans Day thanks all members of the Armed Forces for the sacrifices they have made for the United States' security and freedom. Veterans' Day also began with a different name. It was called Armistice Day after WWI. In 1954 President Eisenhower signed the legislation to rename Armistice Day, Veterans Day.

### ***Recreation Department***

#### ***Park Stickers for 2015!***

While entrances to all Trumbull Parks are open to the public, parking within the parks requires a parking permit. In accordance with the Parks and Recreation Commission regulations, 2015 Parking Permits are issued to Trumbull residents at no cost. (Vehicle registration will serve as proof of residency) Non-Resident Parking Permits may be obtained for a fee of \$112. Commercial vehicles are excluded from Trumbull Parks by Town Ordinance.

**Park visitors will have between now and May 15<sup>th</sup> to obtain a Vehicle Parking sticker.** After May 15th any vehicle not displaying a parking sticker will be subject to a \$25 violation.

Vehicle Parking Permits can be obtained at the Recreation Department (white house across from Town Hall) Monday through Friday from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm, and Saturday mornings from 9:00 am to 12 noon. Guests and Nanny Passes are available through the Recreation Office only.
