Flag Etiquette

When the flag is not flown from a staff, how should it be displayed?

It should be displayed vertically, whether indoors or outside and suspended so that its folds fall free as though the flag were staffed. The stripes may be displayed either horizontally or vertically against a wall; the union should be uppermost and to the flag's own right; that is, to the observer's left. When displayed in a window of a home or a place of business, the flag should be displayed in the same way; that is, with the union or blue field to the left of the observer in the street.

Conduct during playing National Anthem

During rendition of the national anthem when the flag is displayed, all present except those in uniform should stand at attention facing the flag with the right hand over the heart. Men not in uniform should remove their headdress with their right hand and hold it at the left shoulder, the hand being over the heart. Persons in uniform should render the military salute at the first note of the anthem and retain this position until the last note. When the flag is not displayed, those present should face toward the music and act in the same manner they would if the flag were displayed there.


Meaning of the Service Flag

Adopted in 1917, the service flag has a red border around a white rectangle with a blue star in the white field. Each blue star represents a current service member from the family. Flags can have multiple blue stars on the white field. A gold star on the field represents the death of a service member – hence the term “Gold Star Mother”.
