**Bulk Pick-Up Begins**

The bulk pick-up program runs from April through September, and is by appointment only. Each resident is entitled to 1 appointment per year. This is a service which hauls things that you cannot otherwise dispose of yourself, such as furniture, rugs, appliances, mattresses. We'll also pick up branches, brush and metal but they must be in their own respective piles. Unacceptable items would be household trash, hazardous materials, recyclable materials, demolition materials and pieces of wood or metal over 4' long or greater than 6" in diameter. ## SAFETY MESSAGES ABOUT SMOKE ALARMS

Smoke alarms are a key part of a home fire escape plan. When there is a fire, smoke spreads fast. Working smoke alarms give you early warning so you can get outside quickly.

### Safety tips

Install smoke alarms inside each bedroom and sleeping area. Install smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors in the hallway of any sleeping areas and on every level of the home. Install alarms in the basement. Large homes may need extra smoke alarms. It is best to use interconnected smoke alarms. When one smoke alarm sounds they all sound. Test all smoke alarms at least once a month. Press the test button to be sure the alarm is working.

There are two kinds of alarms. Ionization smoke alarms are quicker to warn about flaming fires. Photoelectric alarms are quicker to warn about smoldering fires. It is best to use of both types of alarms in the home. A smoke alarm should be on the ceiling or high on a wall. Keep smoke alarms away from the kitchen to reduce false alarms. They should be at least 10 feet (3 meters) from the stove. People who are [hard-of-hearing or deaf](#) can use special alarms. These alarms have strobe lights and bed shakers. Replace all smoke alarms when they are 10 years old.

## Solicitation Regulations

All transient merchants shall be prohibited from conducting business within the town without first obtaining a license. Application is made through the Chief of Police at least ten days prior to the date of contemplated sale.

On all solicitation to sell, whether made in person, by telephone or otherwise, the permittee shall state his name, his principal's name, and his permit number upon request. The permit is valid only between the hours of 10am and 5 pm.




