#### ***Absentee Ballot Applications***

**Absentee Ballot Applications** are available in the Town Clerk's Office. As soon as college students know their college address, stop by and fill in an application so that we can send them a ballot after October 7<sup>th</sup>! All others may stop by and fill in the application, and if it is after 10/7 we can give you your own ballot. Then you will fill it in and either give it back to us or mail it back.

You can fax the application in (but we need the original) and mail the ballot in (we need the original by Election day, November 8<sup>th</sup>, 2011). Ballots CANNOT be picked up by anyone other than the requester. So, application first, then send it/give it back to us, ballot sent/or given to you, vote and RETURN ASAP.

## ***Absentee Ballot –***

**Make sure your ballot arrives on time! Apply early.**

**Mail early.**

- **Students, if you are a registered voter, please remember to sign up for an absentee ballot as soon as you know your full address at school.**
- **Absentee ballot application forms are available in the Town Clerk's office.**
- **You must fill out an absentee ballot application form in order to receive a ballot for the election. Please *PRINT* legibly!!!**
- **The actual ballot will be mailed to you prior to the election. It is your responsibility to return it before the election.**
- **You may not vote by absentee ballot on the day of the election. Go to the polls to vote on Election Day.**
- **Under usual circumstances one may pick up your ballot for voting, you must pick it up.**

The following items are most needed at our food pantry on Priscilla Place (203-452-5133):

cereals, instant oatmeal, nutri-grain bars, spaghetti sauce, bottled juices and powdered ice tea mixes, lemonade, Gatorade, peanut butter, jelly, peanut butter filled cracker sandwiches, canned fruit, applesauce, snack size fruit, applesauce, raisins, chicken broth, chef-boy-ar-dee canned pasta, instant potatoes, canned white and sweet potatoes, tuna, canned chicken, can stew, chili, manwich, sloppy joe, shampoo, conditioner, deodorant, bar soap, shaving cream, razors, toothpaste and toothbrushes.


## Art Camp at the Trumbull Historical Society was a "Historical Masterpiece!"
