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Trumbull Economic Development Commission Issues Statement on Ethical Practices

Commission states that new and existing businesses in town should adhere to letter and spirit of all laws and regulations

Trumbull, Conn. (October 30, 2007) – At the October meeting of the Trumbull Economic Development Commission, the Commission endorsed a statement on ethical business practices.

It said: “One of the goals of the Economic Development Commission is to seek out appropriate businesses for Trumbull that offer products and services to the community while enhancing the tax base. The Commission seeks out businesses that adhere to the letter and spirit of all laws and regulations and that promote ethical business practices. The Commission believes that new and existing businesses in town should adhere to those standards.

The Commission encourages developers and commercial property owners to have tenants who exhibit ethical and lawful business practices. The Commission will work with and support developers and owners in that regard.”

Commission Chairman Bob Matthews added that “we want businesses in town to have both high ethical standards and strong community participation.” He noted that most firms in town do both. In particular he cited Unilever, People’s United Bank, the Westfield Town Center, Newtown Savings Bank, Tashua Knolls Banquets, Oce, Patriots Bank, United Illuminating, and the Trumbull Marriott for being outstanding community citizens whose business practices reflect favorably on the town.

The mission of the EDC is to service and strengthen the town’s economic base while maintaining Trumbull’s town character and vision of growth.

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
