### Public Comments

The Chair opened Public Comment at 5:15 p.m.

There were no public comments Chairman McGovern closed the Public Comment at 5:16 p.m.

### Approval of the March 8, 2016 Police Commission Meeting Minutes

Motion made to accept the Police Commission Meeting Minutes of March 8, 2016 as presented. Motion made first by Commissioner Zamary, seconded by Commissioner Portanova. There was no further discussion. MOTION CARRIED WITH ONE ABSTENTION Chairman McGovern.

### **Correspondence**

Chief Lombardo sent thank you letters to Sergeant Falkenstein, Officer Anderson and Officer M. Gonzalez who participated in the Honor Guard for the Public Safety Mass at St. Theresa's Church on April 11, 2016.

Chief Lombardo received a Leadership Award from First Selectman Herbst.

Chief Lombardo received a letter from POST for the approval on the lateral entry hire for Officer Reinaldo Arriaga, Jr.

Chief Lombardo received a letter from First Selectman Herbst thanking him for providing a funeral escort for his grandmother's service and a letter to the officers that also assisted in the services.

### **Chief's Report**

Chief Lombardo reviewed the Calls-for-Service report for the month of March. There were a total of 1,671 calls for service for the month of March and the report showed 4,559 calls year-to-date. The Alarm response summary showed a total for the month of March, 152 Alarms, which is slightly down from February. There were 83 Motor Vehicle warnings, 4 DUI Arrests, 18 Motor Vehicle Complaints, and 97 MV Arrests (tickets). There was a total of 202 Motor Vehicle Enforcement cases for the month of March. The Motor Vehicle Enforcement report also showed speeding violations, seatbelt violations, distracted driving, suspended license, traffic light violations and stop sign violations. The Criminal Incident report showed 58 larcenies, 6 vandalism, 1 MV Theft/Attempt, 7 Burglary/Attempt, 3 Assaults, 2 Robberies, 14 domestic incidents with a total of 91 Criminal Incidents for the month of March. The following report showed the Calls for Service by time of day and day of week with a total of 1,585 for the month of March. On the Incident Statistics, the report shows all types of calls the officers respond to with a total of 1,668 incidents for the month of March.

Commissioner Portanova asked about the Alarm categories, and if that is the number of alarms received. Chief Lombardo responded that is correct, the Alarms are broken down by the different types. Commissioner Portanova asked about the 3 Attempted Suicides and whether they were overdoses. Chief Lombardo responded that he was not sure but does not believe they were Narcan related. The call could be someone indicating they are attempting suicide or they could have sent a text or called someone and then the department receives the call.

Chief Lombardo reviewed the Arrest Summary Report for adults it indicated there were 56 arrests for the month of March. The Arrest Summary Report shows the time, arresting officer, type of incident and arrestees name.

### **Traffic Report**

Chief Lombardo reviewed the Traffic Report and indicated there were 40 cases for the month of March. Officer Richard handled 40 cases for the month of March. The report also showed the following:

Officer Richard inspected four Trumbull EMS ambulances as part of their annual inspection requirements.

Members of the Trumbull PD Traffic Unit assisted Monroe PD with a single car fatal accident on Gardner Road in Monroe.

The Traffic Division was asked to review a new street proposal called Sycamore Street, directly off of Pine Street. Officer Richard reviewed the plans and felt that the design has acceptable sight-lines. He also felt that the Hammerhead design did not create any type of issues for police response.

Officer Richard reviewed a request for additional signage at the intersection of Pinewood Trail and Strobel Rd. After an on-site inspection, Officer Richard felt that additional signage was not necessary.

7 Car Seats were installed in February 2016.

1 Bus Citation was issued through Redflex Video System.

### **Training**

Chief Lombardo reviewed the Training Report for the month of March which showed several training courses for the month of March such as ERT Monthly Training-Defensive Tactics, EMR/EMT re-certification course, Police Officer re-certification, NCIC/Collect re-certification, and a Sexual Assault course which Detective Wheeler attended at the University of New Haven. Officer Fedor was the instructor for Narcan certification for Officers at the Fairfield Police Department. The Community Policing report included Officer Fedor's attendance at the TPAUD Enforcement Committee, Counseling Center Board meeting, Medical Responder Meeting and Drug Task Force meeting. Chief Lombardo informed the Commission that on April 26<sup>th</sup> the Drug Task Force is having an Opioid Forum at the McClinch Center of St. Catherine's Church. The forum is an awareness session; it will consist of several speakers.

### **Cadet Report**

Chief Lombardo reviewed the Cadet Activity Report for the month of March which showed three meetings held with the cadets.

### **Sick/Injury Report**

Chief Lombardo reviewed the Sick/Injury report and asked if there were any questions, there were none.

### **Detective Bureau Report**

Chief Lombardo reviewed the Detective Bureau report for the month of March; the department had 89 new cases. They closed 73 cases in the month of March; there are 53 cases that remain open for the month of March.

**EMS Report**

Chief Lombardo reviewed the EMS Report; he reported for the month of March there were a total of 410 calls. EMS covered 388 calls which represents 95% of calls covered; there was a total of 300 Transports. The total response time is 7.3 minutes.

Discussion and Consideration of Promotions, Personnel Matters– EXECUTIVE SESSION


