The meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm by Mr. Boynton followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

**Public Comment**

No public comment.

**Approval of Minutes**

**Motion was made by Ms. Yelner to approve the minutes from September 19, 2023 and June 4, 2024.**

**Seconded by Ms. Laracca and approved by unanimous consent.**

**TNAC Director's Report**

Ms. Baumann shared her report with the Commissioners (attached to the minutes) noting the following:

1. The Center will not be receiving any Town ARPA funds. Funds were given towards COVID-related projects. They had requested funds for support of the programs, a flail mower, a greenhouse that would expand the programs and allow additional programs in the winter and a replacement of the sunflower garden fence. She is hopeful there would be another round of funding.
2. Funding opportunities were reviewed including:
  - a. CT DEEP grant.
  - b. NAA Grant approved by the Town Council and the State which allows companies to receive a tax credit for any donations. Under this grant, TNAC applied to UI and Aquarian. UI said they would get back to her about the grant request.
  - c. State \$100,000 has moved to the next stages but are waiting. TNAC would be a sub-recipient.
3. Tashua Knolls will be doing the butterfly release again with proceeds to the Center.
4. Henkel gave \$10,000 towards a program for fourth graders on climate change.
5. Werth Foundation awarded \$2,400.
6. Sara Cody, Channel 8 News, featured the Center in her new book "Around Every Corner of Connecticut. 100 Towns to Explore Every Season".
7. Very busy with programs in the fall for Trumbull, Newtown, Bridgeport and Woodbridge as well as a home-school group. She has many seasonal programs also listed in her report.
8. Participated in the Farmer's Market with information on Lyme disease, a Find the Tick display, a scavenger hunt for Twin Brooks and a butterfly craft. At the Trumbull Arts Festival, they had the bird glider craft. Fall Festival will be an animal track rubbing.
9. Building projects are not being addressed by the Town.

10. The Five-year Capital Plan is being prepared with a meeting coming up soon. Mr. Estrada noted he will be in touch.

Ms. Yelner asked about the butterfly project at Tashua Knolls. Ms. Baumann noted this a fund raiser where they capture caterpillars from the golf course, put them in a tank and grow them to be released on the property. For a donation, you can name a butterfly.

Mr. Boynton stated he walked the property and questioned what was being done with the following areas:

1. Tree of Heaven attracting the Lantern Flies - Ms. Baumann noted the plan for that area will be to covered with mulch in the Fall which is meant to smother the growth.
2. Trail by the stream – Ms. Baumann agreed it is overgrown. It is the least used trail on the property. The purchase of the flail mower would have helped to clear it.
3. Multifloral rose is abundant.

The meeting was called to order at 7:05 pm by Mr. Boynton followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

**Public Comment**

No public comment.

**Approval of Minutes**

**Approval of the minutes from September 17, 2024 was tabled until the March 2025 meeting.**

**TNAC Director's Report**

Ms. Baumann shared her report with the Commissioners (attached to the minutes) noting the following:

1. The Center has many activities scheduled.
2. The Center received word they received Town ARPA funding for the Grade Four Climate Change Program. Paperwork is being completed and they will start scheduling. Henkle will be a partner in this initiative. The Town set aside a portion of the funding for non-profits. They were looking for programmatic opportunities and this program qualifies. The NAA funding was not received but she has made a contact for next year and expects to be approved.
3. The Building Feasibility Study was discussed. Antinozzi Associates was approved as the architect and will be working with Mr. Estrada to draw up plans and a budget. Funding approved was for the initial drawings by the architect. Funding for the actual implementation of the plans will be done in association with the Town and Rina Bakalar. Since the building is a town building, the non-profit cannot pursue grants for the project. Ms. Bakalar will allow TNAC to help write the narratives for the grants as they have done in the past. Ms. Baumann is pleased the Town is considering upgrading the space from a residential house to a nature center building to accommodate their programs. Ms. Baumann will speak with Ms. Shufrin regarding grant opportunities including the NAA as they will provide funding for energy improvements.

**Old Business**

1. Update – TNAC Building and Grounds - Ms. Baumann noted there are a couple of areas of the building that were brought to the attention of the Town but nothing critical. They will be addressing signage.
2. Update – Five-Year Capital Plan – no further discussion.

**New Business**

1. Discussion and Approval of Meeting Dates for 2025 – quarterly dates were approved for 2025. Meetings will continue to be held on ZOOM.
2. The Annual Meeting of the Patrons will be held on February 1 at 11:00 am. The Commission members are invited. Invitations will be sent in January.
3. Discussion was held regarding a Commissioner being a member of TNAC. Ms. Baumann will send a copy of the TNAC Bylaws to the Commission for their information. This selection will be made at a future date.

There being no further business, motion was made by Ms. Laracca to adjourn the meeting at 7:22 pm. Seconded by Mrs. Shufrin and approved by unanimous consent.

**TNAC Building and Grounds**

- Building
  - o Earlier this month, there were two issues:
    - Lack of heat in the building: the Town had repaired
    - Running toilet in small bathroom: the Patrons repaired
- Grounds
  - o No update

**Town of Trumbull – TNAC Building Feasibility Study and Preliminary Design**

- Antinozzi Associates provided initial drawings for the Building Feasibility Study and Preliminary Design
  - o After several iterations, the Patrons are close to moving ahead with recommending two layouts for the interior of the building
    - Antinozzi will be providing color renderings for two interior options and one exterior option

**Corporate and Community Partnerships**

- Goodwill and Kennedy Collective volunteers will start again in spring 2025
- TNAC will be participating in the Trumbull Farmers Market May 22 and September 25; Arts Festival September 14
  - o Other community activities TBD
- The Patrons will be participating in the Bridgeport Regional Business Council Engage & Grow Expo on March 20<sup>th</sup> at the Total Mortgage Arena in Bridgeport, 1pm – 5pm
  - o The Expo will expose TNAC to over 100 businesses in the region
- The Trumbull Mamas will be holding their annual photo shoot at TNAC on May 4th
- The Patrons will participate in the Long Hill Garden Club plant sale on May 10<sup>th</sup> at Town Hall

**Fundraising**

- State of CT ARPA \$100,000 grant
  - o This grant is being spent down and must be fully expended by 12-31-26
- Town of Trumbull ARPA funding for non-profits – Round 2
  - o The Patrons were awarded this \$4,700 grant
    - Grant will be funding an in-school program on Climate Change for Trumbull elementary school grade 4 students
- Grant seeker
  - o The Patrons contracted with a Grant Professional to identify potential grantors
    - She will present her findings to the Patrons later this month

**Environmental Education Programs**

- 2025 YTD Statistics:
  - o 25 Educational programs completed
  - o 54 Educational programs scheduled (through June 2025)
    - Of those, 31 Programs completed or scheduled for Trumbull students (through June 2025)
  - o 3 Seasonal (family) programs completed

- 16 Seasonal (family programs scheduled (through June 2025)
- The Patrons are providing a Sustainable STEM program to approximately 20 Trumbull High School students during an 8-week after school program
  - This is a Henkel grant-funded program
