Thanks again for letting me know. I will pass this along to Officer Leos and place this in his personnel file.





Department of Justice Awards Nearly \$400 Million for Law Enforcement Hiring to Advance Community Policing

The Department of Justice today announced nearly \$400 million in grant funding through the Department's Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS Office) COPS Hiring Program (CHP). The Attorney General announced funding awards to 596 law enforcement agencies across the nation, which allows those agencies to hire 2,732 additional full-time law enforcement professionals. The awards announced today are inclusive of the \$51 million announced in May as part of Operation Relentless Pursuit.

"The Department of Justice is committed to providing the police chiefs and sheriffs of our great nation with needed resources, tools, and support. The funding announced today will bolster their ranks and contribute to expanding community policing efforts nationwide," said Attorney General William P. Barr. "A law enforcement agency's most valuable assets are the men and women who put their lives on the line every day in the name of protecting and serving their communities."

The COPS Hiring Program is a competitive award program intended to reduce crime and advance public safety through community policing by providing direct funding for the hiring of career law enforcement officers. In addition to providing financial support for hiring, CHP provides funding to state, local, and tribal law enforcement to enhance local community policing strategies and tactics. In a changing economic climate, CHP funding helps law enforcement agencies maintain sufficient sworn personnel levels to promote safe communities. Funding through this program had been on hold since the spring of 2018 due to a nationwide injunction that was lifted earlier this year.

CHP applicants were required to identify a specific crime and disorder problem focus area and explain how the funding will be used to implement community policing approaches to that problem focus area. Forty-three percent of the awards announced today will focus on violent crime, while the remainder of the awards will focus on a variety of issues including school-based policing to fund school resource officer positions, building trust and respect, and opioid education, prevention, and intervention. The COPS Office received nearly 1,100 applications requesting more than 4,000 law enforcement positions.







These are my findings subsequent to the meetings that we have had and the adjustments made to the original proposal regarding traffic safety and the residential development of 5085 Main Street:

1. The proposal to install a left turn only lane from the northbound lane of Main Street into the proposed development has an allowable dimension of 76 feet as illustrated in the provided scaled diagram. This is because the proposed entrance driveway will be what is currently known as Whalburn Avenue and its close proximity to Bonnie View Avenue. Studies show that the average length of a sedan is 15 feet and that the average length of a SUV is 18 feet. These studies also show that motorists typically leave approximately 5 feet between their vehicle and the vehicle that is stopped in front of them while in traffic. Using these measurements, three to four vehicles will be the maximum amount of vehicles in the aforementioned left turning lane. This aligns with the developer's expected amount of vehicles that will be utilizing this left turning lane during the peak hours.
 - a. It is still recommended that the developers propose that the Connecticut State Department of Transportation add a delay to the timing sequence to the traffic control signal at the Route 111 (Main Street) and Route 15 intersection to allow for a programmed "break" in southbound traffic to allow for a safer left turn into the development.
2. An adjustment to the traffic island at the intersection of Main Street and the main entrance into the development (currently known as Whalburn Avenue) is proposed to allow for a mountable curb for vehicles entering but a raised, squared curb for vehicles exiting to discourage exiting vehicles from turning left to continue northerly on Main Street.
3. The proposed exit/entrance driveway into the development from Ring Road across from the north parking deck will still be controlled by a sole stop sign for the exit but the crosswalk will be moved to the intersection of Ring Road and this exit/entrance driveway. This will provide for better visibility of pedestrians to motorists approaching from each direction.

4. Gates have been added to interiors of the entrance/exit driveways to discourage motorists using the development as a cut through. The proposal for these gates have allowed for vehicles to lineup in the driveways while waiting access to be granted thus moving them away from flowing traffic on the travel portions of Main Street, Ring Road and the Main Street entrance driveway to the Trumbull Shopping Park.

In conclusion, I believe that the developers have made every attempt to rectify the concerns brought to them previously and that their adjustments will be adequate.

Attached herewith please find a revised Traffic Site Plan SP-1. The Site Plan has been revised in response to comments provided by the Trumbull Police, Fire, and Emergency Management Services (EMS) departments. The revisions to the plan include the following:

1. A proposed directional entry sign for The Residences at Main has been added to the existing island to the north of the median island at the mall entry drive from Main Street. This sign will direct vehicles to turn left into the mall access driveway to access The Residences at Main.
2. The geometry of the traffic island at the proposed Main Street entrance has been revised to further restrict potential left turns onto Main Street, in addition to the previously proposed signage.
3. Three vehicles have been added to the proposed left turn lane into the site from Main Street to illustrate the amount of stacking. The traffic impact study projects a total of four vehicles turning left during the entire peak hour.
4. Mountable concrete curbing has replaced standard vertical curbing at the traffic islands at the eastern Main Street, and southern mall entry driveways, to allow for greater maneuverability of emergency vehicles.
5. Mountable concrete curbing has replaced standard vertical curbing at the interior parking lot islands, to allow for greater maneuverability of emergency vehicles.
6. The center of the round-about has been changed to stamped concrete with mountable curbing to allow for greater maneuverability of emergency vehicles.
7. Parallel parking along the "streetscape" between buildings has been modified to provide for 36-ft long fire lanes adjacent to the building entry points. A total of five such fire lanes have been added to provide easier access to the buildings for emergency vehicles without blocking parked cars or the travelway.



8. Additional parking spaces have been added at the west end of Building #2, along the streetscape south of Building #3, and to the southeast and east side of the surface parking lot adjacent to Building #3 to maintain the required amount of parking.
9. A 40-ft truck loading space has been added to the streetscape to the south of Building #1, to allow delivery vehicles to load and unload without blocking parked vehicles or the travelway.
10. The stamped concrete pedestrian crosswalk at the mall ring-road has been shifted to the north to coincide with the project's western access drive, and has also been increased to 12-feet wide to create a safer and more visible pedestrian crossing. Pedestrian access to the LA Fitness lot has also been added.
11. Added a gated entry to the project's western, southern, and eastern access driveway. Each access gate will be equipped with devices to allow access to emergency vehicles. The gated entries will eliminate the potential for mall traffic to utilize the residential development as a short-cut.
12. The access gate at the eastern Main Street driveway has been positioned to allow a 47-ft long temporary truck parking space, to allow vehicles to bypass a truck waiting to enter.
13. An emergency generator has been added at the south end of Building #4, which contains the community club house, since this facility is deemed an area of refuge during emergencies and power outages.




- *This neighbor annotated their petition to indicate they'd be happy with "no parking" only on the side of the road with odd number houses and along the upper part of the trail between house #75 and the dead end. The This petition does not include allowing parking along the upper part of the trail because the road narrows at that point and it is our understanding there is not enough room for an emergency vehicle to pass if cars park there.*

Regulations and criteria for parking status change

1. In order for a town street parking status to be changed, the residents and owners of the abutting properties must petition the Police Commission to pass a traffic regulation. The request will be considered only if 60% or more of the abutting property owners that are in favor of the change and there are no negative impacts to public safety.
2. Parking changes must be submitted in one-street increments.
3. List all house numbers in order as they are located on the street. In the case of structures containing multi-dwelling units with one street address number, use a separate line for each unit/apartment located at that address.
4. The petition must be signed by both the residents and owners of apartments and households for all residences on both sides of the street. In addition, only one signature per valid household or apartment will be considered. If the property is a rental, a signature is required of tenant and owner.
5. If a resident/owner is opposed to the change, leave the name and signature spaces blank or write in "opposed."
6. Submit questions/petitions to Police Commission. A preliminary review of the area will be conducted by town staff to determine the extent of the parking conflict and the likely boundaries of the required change.
7. Your request and documentation for a parking status change will be brought before the Police Commission at their next monthly meeting. Notice of the Commission's recommendation(s) and date and time of the commission meeting will be mailed to each property owner of record.
8. If request is approved, streets staff will be notified to place the necessary signage to accomplish the parking status change at no cost to the property owners. Enforcement of the new parking regulations will take place approximately one week after the installation.

Parking exemption:
