OLD BUSINESS OPENED at 7:04 p.m.

Application 19-04 Scott Petitti

Permit approval for in-ground pool within a regulated area at 130 Horse Tavern Road.

This property is located within Aquarion Water Company watershed. Notice is required by Applicant to Aquarion Water Company by certified mail, receipt requested before Commission can proceed with this application. Scott Petitti and his project engineer Fred DeMico were present. The Commission said after walking the site they would like to see the following: plantings between wetlands flag 7 and 9 from the wetlands limit line down to the pond; restoration planting for that area – from lawn back into wetland buffer planting; Ash tree to be removed – leaving stump; split rail fence along wetland limit line with placards; landscape planting plan; pool equipment in northeast corner by elevation 405.5 behind the fence outside the pool area. The Commission asked where the backwash is going to go. Mr. DeMico said it is the type of filter that keeps recirculating. The Commission made suggestions however this will need to be discussed with the Town Engineer.

OLD BUSINESS CLOSED at 7:13 p.m.

By unanimous consent the Commission VOTED to ACCEPT the February 5, 2019 meeting minutes as submitted.

OTHER BUSINESS

Review & approve revised IWWC permit conditions. The Commission was given revised conditions by the IWWC Co-Agent as well as one provided by the Secretary. They briefly discussed the 2 lists and it was decided more time was needed to review and approve them.

The Commission discussed requiring site monitors and bonding for large projects.

The IWWC Co-Agent updated the Commission on Application 15-06: 2207 & 2213 Huntington Turnpike.
