Special Trumbull Police Commission Meeting June 3, 2021

MINUTES

The Special Trumbull Police Commission meeting was called to order via virtual at 3:32 p.m. with the recitation of the pledge.

Discussion and Consideration of Police Officer Entry Level Testing

Chief Lombardo indicated that at the last Police Commission meeting the Commission was asked to terminate the last list in which the entry level police officer test was given over a year ago. Chief Lombardo spoke with Mr. McCarthy and Mr. McCarthy felt it was best that the list *not* be terminated. Mr. McCarthy suggested that the current list be kept, interview the applicants and proceed with the process as some of the applicants could still be interested. At the same time another police officer entry level test will be advertised.

Mr. McCarthy indicated that there is very tight time frame to get seats at the Police Academy. Chief Lombardo informed Mr. McCarthy that the Trumbull Police Department has some seats available in September. Chief

Lombardo, Mary Ann Meier and Mr. McCarthy met, went over a timeline, a step by step process and they all believe the best way to fill the seats at the Academy is to use the existing list of applicants that have already been through the process. The orals can be done immediately. This would move the process along.

A new Entry Level Police Exam has been advertised.

There were no questions.

Commissioner Thornton indicated it sounds like a good plan if it can be moved along as quickly as possible.

Commissioner Magliocco is in favor, the process discussed should be moved along.

Mr. McCarthy informed the Commission that a letter/email was sent to all the previous applicants asking them if they are still interested or not in the Police Entry level position. Twenty applicants responded that they are still interested.

There was no further discussion.

Motion made by Commissioner Thornton to approve the action of reopening the police applicants list that was closed at the last Police Commission meeting, seconded by Commissioner Magliocco. There was no further discussion. Motion passed unanimously.

There being no further business, a motion was made by Commissioner Magliocco and seconded by Commissioner Thornton to adjourn the meeting at 3:37p.m. The motion passed unanimously.
